As we celebrate the joy of the birth of our Savior and await the hope of a new year, I want to provide an update on our battle against COVID-19. Our residents diagnosed with COVID continue their journey of recovery. Our staff have shown their dedication and commitment to serving our residents through these extremely challenging times.

We celebrated Christmas with our residents and staff in a different way this year but made sure the happiness of this Holy Season was felt throughout the facility. Even Santa Claus made a visit on his sleigh, wearing personal protective equipment while cheering our residents! The Life Enrichment staff did a wonderful job making our residents experience a merry Christmas.

We anticipate receiving the first round of vaccines the week of January 4, 2021. Priority will be given to our residents in long term care, including those in personal care and rehabilitation, followed by nursing/clinical staff, and then other support staff. In approximately 3 weeks after the first dose, residents and staff will receive the second one. We pray that immunity from COVID will occur soon after the second dose of vaccine.

Holy Family Manor Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation was the first nursing home in our area to utilize antibodies to treat residents with COVID-19. So far, we have seen significant improvement in the residents who meet the criteria for receiving antibodies. Our medical staff is closely monitoring all of our residents and providing quality of care that is second to none.

On behalf of our staff and residents, I am grateful to you for your ongoing prayers and words of support. We look forward to a new year filled with hope and healing – and pray that the peace of Christ will be with you and your families.
