Happy Springtime! I am writing to provide you with an update on the COVID-19 status at Holy Family Senior Living. Holy Family Senior Living remains free of COVID-19 in both resident and staff populations.

Holy Family Senior Living has held eight (8) Vaccine Clinics to date and are making arrangements for future clinics so we can continue offering the COVID-19 vaccine to new residents and staff.

We are grateful to be able to welcome visitors back on campus. The prescheduled, socially distanced, in-person visitation by family members in our dedicated visitation room on the ground floor have been well received. As the weather warms up we will be able to offer outdoor visits as well. Visitation is limited to 2 people at a time indoors and three people at a time for outdoor visits.
