May – a month of Renewal – make way for Mary, the Model of Virtue

The month of **May** is important in the Catholic Church largely due to it being the traditional time dedicated to deepening the veneration of Our Blessed Mother, Mary. We do this through special devotions, prayers and celebrations that express and cultivate love, reverence, and reliance on her as a spiritual mother and intercessor for us to her Son, Jesus.

The month typically falls during the 50-day Easter season (which ends on May 23 in 2026), with Mary celebrated for her role in the Resurrection and her continued guidance.

It is common for families to create “Mary Altars” or to decorate statues or pictures of Mary in their homes. It is a tradition which became prominent in the 18th century and it serves as a time to focus on Mary, The Mother of God, and her role as a model of faith.

NOTE: as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity occurs the Sunday after Pentecost on May 24, 2026, the Church elevates the Solemnity as the higher rank in the Liturgical calendar. When this happens, the Visitation Feast is commonly omitted.
